2016 Annual Hunting Regulations & Seasons

The following regulations establish season lengths, tag requirements, hunting areas, special restrictions and bag limits regarding general hunting opportunities for cougar, bear, bobcat, coyote, raccoon, Roosevelt elk, black-tailed deer, upland game birds and waterfowl.

The general Off-Reservation Hunting regulations, included herein, provide Quinault hunters with specific information regarding open hunting areas, hunter's responsibilities, bag limits and season lengths for the 2015 hunting season. *Please note that both Rayonier in the Copalis unit 642 and Weyerhaeuser and Green Diamond in the Wynoochee unit 648 (specifically the Satsop area) have largely gone to fee permits and are not open to public hunting.*

In addition to these annual regulations, the Quinault's Title 51 (Fishing/Hunting/Gathering) contains requirements pertaining to: eligible hunters, permits, firearms restrictions, enforcement, violations and criminal offenses.

NOTE:

The State of Washington requires a Discover Pass for parking at or use of state parks and properties. **Tribal members lawfully exercising their treaty rights ARE NOT subject to state law.** Until such time as the Quinault Nation works out an acceptable system for Quinault tribal members to access state lands without harassment, please report any violation notices or tickets issued for failure to have a Discover Pass to the Quinault Office of the Attorney General at 360.276.8215 ext. 220 and QDNR Resource Protection. Quinault attorneys will assist you in resolving notices/tickets.

SECTION I.

BIG GAME HUNTING

SECTION II. Special Provisions

1. Enrolled Quinault Tribal Members must apply for and receive a game tag from the FISH AND GAME Office in Taholah or Queets Office prior to hunting for big game. You must present a Quinault Tribal Enrollment Card in order to receive a hunting tag. Regular working hours are from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Monday – Friday, excluding holidays.
 2. All big game killed under these regulations must have a 2015 game tag tied to the animal and appropriately punched when being transported. The tag must remain with the majority of the animal until the animal is butchered.
- **Hunting Off-Reservation (DH):** The person who needs a DH must contact the FISH AND GAME Office with a justifiable reason why they are unable to hunt for themselves. Persons who do not comply with this process may be cited for Aiding and Abetting.

- A Designated Hunter Permit is issued to the person qualified to have a Designated Hunter hunt for them. Conditions qualifying a person to have a designated hunter are as follows.
 - a. Quinault Elder;
 - b. Suffered a serious injury that wouldn't allow that person to provide for their family;
 - c. Single parent families that aren't able to hunt for themselves.
 - d. Person with a disability means:
 - A person who has a permanent disability and is not ambulatory over natural terrain without a lower extremity prosthesis or must permanently use a medically prescribed assistive device for mobility, including, but not limited to, a wheelchair, crutch, cane, walker, or oxygen bottle; or
 - A person who has a permanent disability and is physically incapable of holding and safely operating a firearm or other legal hunting device.
 - This definition includes, but is not limited to, persons with a permanent upper or lower extremity impairment who have lost the use of one or both upper or lower extremities, or who have a diagnosed permanent disease or disorder which substantially impairs or severely interferes with mobility or the use of one or both upper or lower extremities for holding and safely operating a firearm or other legal device; or
 - A person who is blind or visually impaired.

NOTE: *A designated hunter can only possess two tags at a time (their own and the person they are designated to hunt for). Designated Hunters must register with the Fish and Game office as Designated Hunters and be assigned an approved person to hunt for.*

3. **ENROLLED TRIBAL MEMBERS PROHIBITED FROM CARRYING FIREARMS ARE STRICTLY PROHIBITED FROM HUNTING WITH A FIREARM.** SUCH PERSONS MAY APPOINT A DESIGNATED HUNTER TO HUNT FOR THEM, PROVIDED THAT THE DESIGNATED HUNTER OBTAINS WRITTEN AUTHORIZATION FROM THE FISH AND GAME OFFICE. NO TAG IS VALID IF YOU ARE PROHIBITED FROM CARRYING A FIREARM, UNLESS HUNTING WITH A BOW. SUCH HUNTERS CAN NOT BE WITH ANOTHER PERSON IN POSSESSION OF A FIREARM IF THEY ARE NOT HUNTING.
4. It is unlawful to shoot at wildlife with a firearm across or along the maintained portion of a public highway. 51.16.010(d) Firearms carried in vehicles, motor boats or on motorcycles shall not be loaded with live ammunition except for firearms carried by regular law enforcement officers. Hunting is not allowed within city limits.

5. The Fish & Game Office, for special ceremonies, churches or other community functions, may issue ceremonial permits at any time. Ceremonial hunts shall be conducted according to Title 51 Conservation Ordinance.
6. Minors (between the ages of 13-18) must be: 1) accompanied by an adult when hunting, and 2) pass a hunters safety class before they can obtain hunting tags.
7. **HUNTING HOURS** – Authorized hunting hours for big game during established Seasons are one-half hour before sunrise to one-half hour after sunset.
8. **Enrolled Quinault Tribal hunters may hunt with non-Tribal members during Non-Tribal hunting seasons under the following circumstances:**
 1. The Quinault hunter must have a valid permit from the Quinault Indian Nation;
 2. The Quinault hunter must be hunting within designated off-Reservation Tribal hunting areas; and
 3. The non-Tribal hunter must be hunting the same type of game as the Quinault Tribal hunter and be in compliance with Washington State hunting Regulations.
9. Trapping or hunting of fur-bearing animal is allowed, with the following restrictions:
 1. Trapping or hunting of fur-bearing animals for ceremonial and subsistence use shall be closed from February 20th through May 31st.
 2. Each trap must be plainly marked with the enrollment number of the person operating the trap; and
 3. Location of trap-line must be registered with the Fish & Game Office.

10. PROHIBITED HUNTING METHODS

- a) Hunting under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs is prohibited.
- b) Hunting big game with the aid of an artificial light or spotlight is prohibited.
- c) Using aircraft to spot locate or report the location of wildlife for the purpose of hunting, or hunting of big game on the same day you are airborne is prohibited.
- d) Hunting with dogs is illegal.

- e) **Use of drones or any unmanned aircraft to spot, harass, concentrate, chase or aid in any form of hunting is prohibited.**

NOTE: It is illegal to hunt, kill or possess eagles, osprey, swans, seagulls, crows, pelicans and all migratory birds.

11. **Off Road and Non-Highway Vehicles:** No person shall operate a non-highway vehicle or motor boat in such a way as to run down or harass any wildlife or animal, nor carry, transport, or convey any loaded weapon in or upon, nor hunt from, any non-highway vehicle except by permit issued by the Quinault Nation Division of Natural Resources. Any non-highway vehicle may be used to travel to and from a hunting area and to transport game. **VIOLATION OF THIS SECTION IS A GROSS MISDEMEANOR.**
12. **Community Cooler:** Game meat stored in the community cooler/freezer shall be hung or stored in the cooler/freezer unattended for a maximum 10 days. Meat not attended or stored longer than 10 days shall be considered abandoned and donated to the Taholah Food Bank. All meat left in the cooler/freezer must be tagged. Any untagged meat will be donated to the food bank immediately.

SECTION III. HARVEST MANAGEMENT/DATA COLLECTION

1. **REPORTING OF ALL BAGGED GAME:** All wild game killed must be reported to the Fish & Game Office, or Resource Protection Officer within 3 business days of the kill. Reporting can be either in person, writing or telephone contact conveying the Quinault Tribal enrollment number, tag number, game species harvested, sex of game, area, date, and location. A violation of this Section is a Class "C" Offense in accordance with Title 51 of Q.T.C. Laws.

4. **TRANSPORTATION PERMITS:** Upon bagging game in legal areas, the hunter must notch the date on the Quinault Indian Nation Hunting Permit to make a valid Game Transport Permit for transporting from the field to the desired destination.

SECTION VI.

GUN CALIBER

1. **Rifles:** Big game must be hunted with a minimum of .223 caliber (6mm) centerfire rifle. Rimfire rifles are not legal for big game harvest. The rifle cartridge bullet must weigh more than 85 grains or develops more than 900 foot pounds of energy at 100 yards. Use of full automatic rifles is forbidden.
2. **Shotguns:** Must use a 20 gauge or larger using shells loaded with slugs or buckshot size #1 or larger for big game hunting.
3. **Handguns:** Big game may be hunted with handguns with a minimum barrel length of 4" inches per manufacturer's specification and fire a minimum .24 centerfire cartridge. Rimfire handguns are not legal for big game.
4. **Loaded Firearms in a Vehicle:** It is illegal to carry, convey, transport, possess or control a loaded shotgun or rifle in any motor vehicle. A rifle or a shotgun containing shells or cartridges in either the chamber or magazine is considered loaded.

BOW AND ARROW REGULATIONS

1. It is unlawful for any person to hunt big game animal with a bow that possess less than 40 pounds of pull measured at 28 inches or less draw length.
2. It is unlawful to hunt big game animals with any arrows other than those having sharp broadhead blade or blades at least 7/8 inches wide or mechanical broad heads. The broadhead must be unbarbed and completely closed at the back end of the blade or blades by a smooth unbroken surface starting at maximum blade width forming a smooth line toward the feather end of the shaft and such line shall not angle toward the point.
3. It is unlawful to shoot at wildlife with an arrow from a vehicle or from across or along the maintained portion of a public highway.

MUZZLELOADER REGULATIONS

1. Muzzleloader is a firearm that's loaded from the muzzle and uses black powder or substitute.

2. It is unlawful to carry, convey, transport, possess or control a loaded muzzleloader in any motor vehicle. A muzzleloader will be considered loaded if a powder charge and projectile, either shot or single projectile, are in the barrel and the barrel or breech is capped or primed.
3. It is unlawful to hunt wildlife using a muzzleloader that doesn't meet these specifications:
 - a. Muzzleloader shotgun or rifle used for deer must be .40 caliber or larger to hunt for deer.
 - b. Muzzleloader shotgun or rifle used to hunt all other big game must be .45 caliber or larger.


