Salmon River Sport Fishery Regulation – 01 2016 Fall Season

To: Quinault Tribal Members

Subject: Sport Fishing on the Salmon River, September 1, 2016 to December 01, 2016

The Salmon River within the Quinault Reservation will be open to sport fishing using hook and line methods from September 1 through December 01, 2016.

The river is open to the following species and size classes of fish:

- Steelhead
- Cutthroat
- Native char
- Jack chinook salmon (less than 24 inches in size)
- Jack coho salmon (less than 20 inches in size)
- Adult coho (greater than 20 inches in size)

The daily bag limit of fish which may be retained is as follows:

Steelhead	3 fish
Cutthroat	2 fish
Native char	2 fish
Jack salmon	12 fish
Hatchery Marked Adult coho with a clipped AD fin	3 fish

Marked coho with an adipose clip have a healed over scar located in the between the dorsal fin and tail fin, where the small fleshy fin is normally located.

Each fisher may use up to two fishing poles under their control (within arms reach). There will be a limit of three (3) non-enrolled Quinault fishers per enrolled Quinault tribal member. The Quinault tribal member and each of their accompanying non-enrolled Quinault fishers shall conduct their guiding and fishing in the company of each other for the full term of fishing at any authorized Queets on-reservation fishing location. The non-enrolled Quinault fishers shall always be located within 75 feet of the enrolled Quinault tribal member while on or approaching the fishing location

Catches of salmon and steelhead must be reported at either the Queets fisheries office or the central fisheries office in Taholah within 72 hours of capture. All individuals, including guides, who participate in the fishery, must fulfill all requirements of eligibility described in Title 51. Fish caught in this fishery cannot be sold for any purpose. **NO SNAGGING.**
