Quinault River Sport Fishing Regulation - 02 Cook Creek Sport Fishing 2018 Fall Season

TO: Quinault Tribal Members

SUBJECT: Sport Fishing on Cook Creek – Nov. 6, 2018 to December 01, 2018-Bag limit Chum

This regulation replaces regulation # 1. Cook Creek and its tributaries within the Quinault Reservation boundaries are open to hook and line fishing Nov. 6, 2018 to December 01, 2018. It will be open to the taking of the following bag limits:

Steelhead	2
Cutthroat	6
Native Char	2
Coho	3
Chum	2

Capture and retention of Chinook is strictly prohibited.

Catch and release of steelhead is prohibited; therefore, anglers must cease fishing after 2 steelhead are caught.

*****Snagging is Prohibited.**

Cook Creek is open to hook and line fishing from its mouth at the Quinault River, upstream to the boundary marker (a cement block painted red), approximately 88 feet downstream of the Quinault National Fish Hatchery weir. The waters of Cook Creek between the boundary marker and the hatchery weir are closed; therefore no casting is permitted into this area.


Each fisher is limited to the use of one fishing pole.

An enrolled Quinault tribal member must accompany all non-Quinault fishers. The Quinault member must be within 100 feet of their non-Quinault guest/client while fishing. Guides are required to be at least 18 years of age. There will be a limit of three (3) non-enrolled Quinault fishers per enrolled Quinault tribal member.

All sport fishery catches must be reported to the Fish and Game Commission. All guides while engaged in guiding shall report catches by themselves and their customers to the Fish & Game Office or Fisheries Office. All catches are to be reported to: (360) 276-8215 ext. 203.

The Quinault National Fish Hatchery gates will be open daily from 7:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Parking of sport fishermen vehicles is permitted in the parking lot next to the visitor center.
