COOK CREEK 2018 SPRING/SUMMER FISHERY SPORT FISHING REGULATION – 01

TO: Quinault Tribal Members

SUBJECT: Sport Fishing on Cook Creek – Friday June 1 through July 31, 2018 – Stat Wks 22-32

Cook Creek and its tributaries within the Quinault Reservation boundaries are open to hook and line fishing June 1, 2018 through July 31, 2018.

The daily bag limit is as follows through July 31:

Cutthroat	6 fish
Native Char	2 fish
Adult Steelhead	1 fish

The bag limit for Native Char is 4 fish for the Quinault River and Cook Creek combined.

The bag limit for Adult Steelhead is 1 fish for the Quinault River and Cook Creek combined.

Cook Creek is open to hook and line fishing from its mouth at the Quinault River, upstream to the boundary marker (a cement block painted red), approximately 88 feet downstream of the Quinault National Fish Hatchery weir. The waters of Cook Creek between the boundary marker and the hatchery weir are closed; therefore no casting is permitted into this area.

Each fisher is limited to the use of one (1) fishing pole.

An enrolled Quinault tribal member must accompany all non-Quinault fishers. The Quinault member must be within 100 feet of their non-Quinault guest/client while fishing. Guides are required to be at least 18 years of age. There will be a limit of three (3) non-enrolled Quinault fishers per enrolled Quinault tribal member.


All sport fishery catches **MUST** be reported to the QDNR permits office at ext. 7372 in Taholah with 72 hours of the catch. All guides while engaged in guiding shall report catches by themselves and their customers to the QDNR permits office..



All sport fishery catches **MUST** be reported to the QDNR permits office at ext. 7372 in Taholah with 72 hours of the catch. All guides while engaged in guiding shall report catches by themselves and their customers to the QDNR permits office..

The Quinault National Fish Hatchery gates will be open daily from 7:30 am to 4:00 pm. Parking of sport fishermen vehicles is permitted in the parking lot next to the visitor center.

**Fish caught in this fishery CANNOT be sold for any purpose.
Walking on redds is prohibited.**
