SUBJECT: On-Reservation, Subsistence Harvest of Pt. Grenville Razor Clams

The On-Reservation area, Pt. Grenville Beach, is open to subsistence harvest of razor clams by enrolled tribal members at the following times:

Latest test results indicate current biotoxin levels are within health guidelines.

The daily limit is 100 razor clams per person.

Digging for dependants is allowed only if dependant(s) are present at the beach within eyesight of designated tribal harvester(s).

All clams dug will be for personal use only. No commercial sales.

Digging is limited to two hours prior to book-low tide and is terminated one hour after book-low tide.

All clams dug shall be retained. Small or broken clams shall not be returned to the beach once harvested.


All provisions of the Quinault Tribal Code, Title 51, will be in effect.


This regulation only applies to enrolled members of the Quinault Indian Nation who will participate in the clam fishery. All clam diggers will be required to show Quinault identification.

Non Tribal members will not be allowed on the beach during clam digs.

Elder Digging Area – Per LNRC agreement on 6/16/14, the area of Pt. Grenville beach north of the first (upper) approach has been designated for elders only clam digging.

This regulation may be rescinded based on further clam biotoxin testing.
