Queets River Winter Sport Fishing Regulation – 01 2017 2018 Winter Season

To: Quinault Tribal Members
Quinault Fisheries Enforcement
Date: November 27, 2017
From: Queets River Committee
Subject: Sport Fishing on the Queets River, December 1, 2017 to February 28, 2018

The Queets River and its tributaries (this regulation also applies to Salmon River) within the Quinault Reservation will be open to sport fishing using hook and line methods. The fishery provisions for the Month of March will be set in a subsequent regulation.

The fishery is open to taking of the following species:

Steelhead
Cutthroat
Native Char
Perch


The daily bag limit is as follows:

Steelhead	3
Cutthroat	2
Native Char	4
Perch	No Limit

Gear is restricted to the use of standard fishing poles with hook and line methods. Each fisher is required to remain within reach and in control of all of their fishing gear while fishing. There will be a limit of three (3) non-enrolled Quinault fishers per enrolled Quinault tribal member. Catches of salmon and steelhead must be reported at either the Queets fisheries office or the central fisheries office in Taholah within 72 hours of capture. All individuals, including guides, who participate in the fishery, must fulfill all requirements of eligibility described in Title 51. Fish caught in this fishery cannot be sold for any purpose. *All boats used in this fishery must be owned and operated by an enrolled member of the Quinault Indian Nation.* **SNAGGING IS PROHIBITED**

All sport fishery catches must be reported to the Fish and Game Commission. All catches are to be reported to: (360) 276-8215 ext. 203. All guides while engaged in guiding shall report catches by themselves and their customers in logbooks provided the Fish & Game Office or Fisheries Office.
