Quinault River Sport Fishing Regulation –01 2016 Fall Season

TO: Quinault Tribal Members
Quinault Fisheries Enforcement
FROM: Quinault River Fish Committee
DATE: July 27, 2016
SUBJECT: Sport Fishing on the Quinault River – Aug. 1, 2016 to December 01, 2016

The Quinault River and its tributaries (excluding Cook Creek, covered by separate regs.) will be open to hook and line fishing excluding those times and areas described below; within the Quinault Reservation boundaries. The following bag limit will apply during the openings:

Steelhead	3
Cutthroat	12
Adult Chinook	1
Jack Chinook (less than 24 inches)	no limit
Adult Coho	3
Jack Coho	no limit
Chum	2
Native Char	4

Each fisher is limited to the use of one fishing pole.

All non-enrolled Quinault fishers must be accompanied by an enrolled Quinault tribal member while fishing. Also, all non-enrolled Quinault fishers must be within 100 feet of their enrolled Quinault tribal member while fishing.


There will be a limit of three (3) non-enrolled Quinault fishers per enrolled Quinault tribal member on the banks of the Quinault River and its tributaries.

All boats used for sport fishing must be owned and operated by an enrolled Quinault tribal member. Maximum horsepower is 75.

Sport fishing below the Ranch: See addendum 4 for Time Restrictions on hook and line fishing below the Ranch.

All sport fishery catches must be reported to the Fish and Game Commission. All guides while engaged in guiding shall report catches by themselves and their customers to the Fish & Game Office or Fisheries Office. All catches are to be reported to: (360) 276-8215 ext. 372 or ext. 558.
