## RAFT RIVER 2018 SPRING/SUMMER FISHERY SPORT FISHING REGULATION – 01

SUBJECT: Sport fishing on Raft River from June 1 to August 31, 2018 – Stat Wks 22-36

---

Raft River and its tributaries will be open to sport fishing using hook & line methods.

**The fishery will be open to taking the following species and the daily bag limits are as follows:**

<b>Steelhead</b>	<b>1 fish</b>
<b>Cutthroat</b>	<b>6 fish</b>
<b>Native Char</b>	<b>2 fish</b>

**Each fisher is limited to the use of one (1) fishing pole.**

All non-enrolled fishers **MUST** be accompanied by an enrolled Quinault tribal member while fishing. Also, all non-enrolled fishers **MUST** be within 100 feet of their enrolled Quinault tribal member while fishing. There will be a limit of three (3) non-enrolled fishers per enrolled Quinault tribal member. All individuals, including guides, who participate in the fishery, **MUST** fulfill all requirements of eligibility described in Title 51. All boats used for sport fishing **MUST** be owned and operated by enrolled Quinault members.


**Fish caught in this fishery CANNOT be sold for any purpose.**

**Walking on redds is prohibited.**

Guides must be authorized by annually registering with the Quinault Fish and Game Secretary's Office. All guides are required to report catches from all clients as well as themselves, when guiding, in a logbook to be turned into the Fish & Game Secretary's Office each year.

All sport fishery catches **MUST** be reported to the QDNR permits office at ext. 7372 in Taholah within 72 hours of the catch. All guides while engaged in guiding shall report catches by themselves and their customers to the QDNR permits office..
