## Raft River Winter Sport Fishing Regulation – 01 2013-2014 Winter Season

To: Quinault Tribal Members Date: November 26, 2013  
Quinault Fisheries Enforcement  
From: Quinault Fish and Game Commission  
Subject: Sport Fishing on the Raft River, December 1, 2013 to April 30, 2014

The Raft River and its tributaries will be open to sport fishing using hook and line methods.

The fishery is open to taking of the following species:

Steelhead  
Cutthroat  
Native Char

The daily bag limit is as follows:



| Steelhead   | 1 fish |
| Cutthroat   | 6 fish |
| Native Char | 3 fish |

Each fisher is limited to the use of one fishing pole. All non-enrolled Quinault fishers must be accompanied by an enrolled Quinault tribal member while fishing. Also, all non-enrolled Quinault fishers must be within 100 feet of their enrolled Quinault tribal member while fishing.


There will be a limit of three (3) non-enrolled Quinault fishers per enrolled Quinault tribal member. All individuals, including guides, who participate in the fishery, must fulfill all requirements of eligibility described in Title 51. Fish caught in this fishery cannot be sold for any purpose. *All boats used for sport fishing must be enrolled Quinault owned and operated.*

Walking on redds is prohibited.

Guides are required to be at least 18 years of age. All guides while engaged in guiding shall report catches by themselves and their customers to the Fish & Game Office or Fisheries Office. Catches are to be reported to: (360) 276-8215 ext. 203.
