QUINULT INDIAN NATION CRITICAL SERVICES

On March 23, 2020, the Business Committee of the Quinault Indian Nation adopted a resolution encouraging all Nation citizens to stay home, except as needed to maintain continuity of operations of essential critical infrastructure sectors and additional sectors as are critical to protect health and well-being of all Nation citizens and all Washingtonians.

In accordance with this order, the Business Committee has designated the following list of “Essential Critical Infrastructure Workers” to help tribal, and industry partners as they work to protect the Quinault Nation and our neighboring communities, while ensuring continuity of functions critical to public health and safety, as well as economic security.

HEALTHCARE / PUBLIC HEALTH

- Health care providers and caregivers (e.g., physicians, dentists, psychologists, mid-level practitioners, nurses and assistants, infection control and quality assurance personnel, pharmacists, physical and occupational therapists and assistants, alternative healthcare providers, social workers, speech pathologists and diagnostic and therapeutic technicians and technologists.
- Behavioral health workers (including mental and substance use disorder) responsible for coordination, outreach, engagement, and treatment to individuals in need of mental health and/or substance use disorder services.
- Workers that manage health plans, billing, and health information, who cannot practically work remotely.
- Workers who conduct community-based public health functions.
- Workers who provide support to vulnerable populations to ensure their health and well-being, including family care providers.
- Workers who support food, shelter, and social services, and other necessities of life for economically disadvantaged or otherwise needy individuals, such as those residing in shelters.
- Pharmacy employees necessary for filling prescriptions.
- Workers who coordinate with other organizations to ensure the proper recovery, handling, identification, transportation, tracking, storage, and disposal of human remains and personal effects and facilitate access to behavioral health services to the family members, responders, and survivors of an incident.

EMERGENCY SERVICES SECTOR

Law Enforcement, Public Safety and First Responders

- Front line and management personnel, including emergency management, law enforcement, resource enforcement, Emergency Management Systems, fire, and corrections, search and rescue, and tactical teams.
- Emergency Medical Technicians.

- Public Safety Answering Points and 911 call center employees.
- Fire Mitigation Activities
- Hazardous material responders and hazardous devices teams, from government and the private sector.
- Workers—including contracted vendors—who maintain digital systems infrastructure supporting law enforcement and emergency service operations.

Public Works

- Workers who support the operation, inspection, and maintenance of essential public works facilities and operations, including bridges, water and sewer main breaks, fleet maintenance personnel, construction of critical or strategic infrastructure, traffic signal maintenance, emergency location services for buried utilities, maintenance of digital systems infrastructure supporting public works operations, and other emergent issues
- Workers such as plumbers, electricians, exterminators, and other service providers who provide services that are necessary to maintaining the safety, sanitation, and essential operation of residences.
- Support, such as road and line clearing, to ensure the availability of needed facilities, transportation, energy and communications. Support to ensure the effective removal, storage, and disposal of residential and commercial solid waste and hazardous waste.

FOOD AND AGRICULTURE

- Workers supporting groceries, pharmacies, and other retail that sells food and beverage products, including but not limited to grocery stores, corner stores and convenience stores, including liquor stores that sell food, Farmers' markets, food banks, farm and produce stands, supermarkets, and similar food retail establishments.
- Restaurant carry-out and quick serve food operations, including food preparation, carry-out and delivery food employees.
- Food manufacturer and processor employees and their supplier employees.
- Employees and firms supporting food, feed, and beverage distribution (including curbside distribution and deliveries), including warehouse workers, vendor-managed inventory controllers, blockchain managers, distribution.
- Workers supporting the sanitation of all food manufacturing processes and operations from wholesale to retail
- Workers essential for assistance programs and government payments.
- Workers who support the manufacture and distribution of forest products, including, but not limited to timber, paper, and other wood products.

ENERGY-PETROLEUM

- Retail fuel centers such as gas stations.

WATER AND WASTEWATER

- Operational staff at water authorities.
- Operational staff at community water systems.

- Operational staff at wastewater treatment facilities.
- Workers repairing water and wastewater conveyances and performing required sampling or monitoring.
- Operational staff for water distribution and testing.
- Operational staff at wastewater collection facilities.

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

- Workers who support command centers, including, but not limited to Network Operations Command Center, Broadcast Operations Control Center and Security Operations Command Center.
- Workers supporting the provision of essential global, national and local infrastructure for computing services (incl. cloud computing services), business infrastructure, web-based services, and critical manufacturing.
- Data center operators, including system administrators, HVAC & electrical engineers, security personnel, IT managers, data transfer solutions engineers, software and hardware engineers, and database administrators.
- Client service centers, field engineers, and other technicians supporting critical infrastructure.
- Workers responding to cyber incidents involving critical infrastructure, including medical facilities and other critical infrastructure categories and personnel.
- Workers supporting communications systems and information technology used by law enforcement, public safety, medical, energy and other critical industries.
- Support required for continuity of services, including janitorial/cleaning personnel.

GOVERNMENT OPERATIONS AND ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

- Critical government workers necessary to the maintenance of basic Nation governmental functions as defined by the Nation's COVID-19 Incidence Response Team.
- Tribal Courts and essential personnel.
- Workers who provide or determine eligibility for food, shelter, in-home supportive services, child welfare, adult protective services and social services, and other necessities of life for economically disadvantaged or otherwise needy individuals (including family members and individuals experiencing homelessness).
- Worker involved in the management and protection of Treaty resources, including on- and off-reservation fisheries.
- Workers to ensure continuity of building functions.
- Federal, State, and Local, Tribal, and Territorial employees who support Mission Essential Functions and communications networks.
- Construction workers who support the construction, operation, inspection, and maintenance of construction sites and construction projects (including housing construction) for all essential facilities, services and projects included in this document, and for residential construction related to emergency repairs and projects that ensure structural integrity.

- Workers such as plumbers, electricians, exterminators, and other service providers who provide services that are necessary to maintaining the safety, sanitation, and essential operation of construction sites and construction projects (including those that support such projects to ensure the availability of needed facilities, transportation, energy and communications and support to ensure the effective removal, storage, and disposal of solid waste and hazardous waste).
- Commercial Retail Stores that supply essential sectors, including convenience stores.
- Professional services, such as legal or accounting and tax preparation services, when necessary to assist in compliance with legally mandated activities and critical sector services.
- Professional services pertaining to payroll benefits, regulatory assistance and HR services.
- Workers who are needed to process and maintain systems for processing financial transactions and services (e.g., payment, clearing, and settlement; wholesale funding; insurance services; and capital markets activities).
- Workers who support financial operations, such as those staffing data and security operations centers.

FINANCIAL SERVICES

- Workers who are needed to provide consumer access to banking and lending services, including ATMs, and to move currency and payments (e.g., armored cash carriers).
